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#### THE WAR ON TOBACCO



Hospital Al-Sultan Abdullah (HASA) is committed in fighting the war on tobacco. In 2023, HASA officially launched its Tobacco-Free Hospital Policy which effectively bans any forms of tobacco, including e-cigarettes, from being smoked, used or consumed on hospital grounds.

Smoking or Vaping in healthcare facility is prohibited by law. Offence against this regulation is liable to a fine of up to RM10,000 and/or 2 years imprisonment.

#### **Enforcement**

The Environmental Health (EH) Unit, in collaboration with Polis Bantuan HASA are tasked with ensuring the Tobacco-Free Hospital Policy is enforced in the hospital. They do regular inspections on smoking hotspot areas and respond to any reports of smoking in HASA.

#### Are we at risk?

Jobs related to providing service and care such as healthcare workers, customer service officers and others, are among the likeliest group to encounter violence at the workplace.

In a recent survey conducted by OSH unit, many of our staff report having been victims of workplace violence at least once. Unfortunately, many of these same staff have mistakenly accepted the violence they experience in the workplace as simply part and parcel of their job.



#### Sexual harassment is a serious form of violence too!!



Sexual harassment, which is any form of unwelcomed sexual conduct be it verbal, physical or written, is a form of violence that many workers are unaware of.

Since the OSH unit started its anti-violence at work campaign this year, there has been a surge in the number of sexual harassment reporting. Although this number is concerning, it demonstrates that people are becoming more aware of this issue. The ultimate goal is for all staff to know their rights and stand up against any form of workplace violence, including sexual harassment.

#### What should I do?

Since the start of the year, OSH Unit has been aggressively campaigning for zero tolerance toward workplace violence. A guidebook has also been launched to act as a reference for all staff in handling workplace violence.

If you experience any form of workplace violence, you must get yourself to safety first and get help. You should activate Code Grey (call 5555) if the violence gets out of control. Eventually, a report can be sent via the incident reporting system and OSH Unit will take appropriate actions to address the case.


## How can I prevent workplace violence?

The majority of incidents of violence at the workplace are actually preventable. Poor communication skills and a non-conducive environment greatly contributes to violence at the workplace.

Service and care providers such as hospital staff are encouraged to practice good personality and communication skills to avoid such situations. A handy trick is by using the 5S strategy when dealing with clients and customers, as this may help in defusing any potential incidents of violence.

#### **CASTING A SPOTLIGHT ON JKKPP**

JKKPP was established in Hospital Al-Sultan Abdullah, UiTM in January 2022.



#### WHAT DOES THE LAW SAY?

The establishment of JKKPP is a mandatory requirement by law for any workplace consisting of 40 or more workers. This is outlined in the Occupational Safety and Health Act 1994 (Act 514).



JKKPP consists of representatives from workers and management who meet regularly to:

- cooperate in identifying, evaluating and controlling hazards at the workplace.
- participate in the development, implementation and evaluation of safety and health programs.
- act as an effective channel of communication to discuss and propose resolutions to any OSHE problems.

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# Employer's GENERAL OSHE RESPONSIBILITIES

The hospital management is responsible to:

- ensure and maintain a healthy and safe environment at the workplace
- provide information and training related to safety and health
- be aware of all hazards in the workplace
- implement appropriate control measures for all hazards
- regularly evaluate effectiveness of control measures that are in place

# NOTICE

Employers who do not comply with OSHA 1994 are liable to a fine not exceeding RM50,000 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years or both.




