

Updates from Department of Quality Improvement and Patient Safety (QIPS) by Dr. Julina Md Noor

As the HUITM Puncak Alam is nearing its completion, Department of QIPS is working hard to prepare all the documents that are necessary for the running of the hospital. QIPS are happy to report that the final draft for General Hospital Operational Policy (GHOP) and Medical Bylaws are now ready and currently being reviewed by HUITM Law Office. These two hospital documents were the results of a combined effort of top managements, various head of departments along with many others. The workshop took place at Awana Hotel, Genting Highlands on 17-19th Aug 2020, attended by Dean of relevant faculties, including Faculty of Medicine UiTM to ensure both GHOP and Medical Bylaws are accurate and applicable.

Following these, Department of QIPS continued working on Clinical Department policies. The objective was to ensure that all clinical departments will be ready to start their services with clear policies in place when HUITM Puncak Alam starts its operation. All clinical heads and team were involved and dedicated to present their documents at the Dorsett Hotel, Putrajaya on 28-30th Sept 2020.

QIPS's next tasks will be on Clinical Support Department policies which will take place early next year. At the same time, Department of QIPS is also in the process of making sure all the forms are streamlined, compiled and recorded and ready by March 2021.
